Greetings to the faithful of Dixon First UMC,

What a whirlwind of change in our lives we have had since our last Herald! I am reminded of **Hebrews 13:8** "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever." with all the radical change of daily living caused by the COVID 5³ virus, Jesus remains the same. That is something as they say, "We can take to the bank!" It is times of struggle and change that remind us how important our faith in Jesus Christ is to our daily living. It is a reminder of where our strength to face the unknown without fear comes from.

Also, I am reminded of Matthew 7:24-27 "Everyone then who hears these words of mine and does them will be like a wise man who built his house on the rock. And the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house, but it did not fall, because it had been founded on the rock. And everyone who hears these words of mine and does not do them will be like a foolish man who built his house on the sand. And the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat against that house, and it fell, and great was the fall of it."

In the telling of this story, Jesus is reminding us how important it is to have our relationship with God through Jesus in place before the storms of life hit. I am so grateful for two things that we have done so far in 2020 to help us fortify our faith before the COVID 19 virus arrived.

The first was to seek God's vision for our church and our own lives at the beginning of 2020. It might sound a little ridiculous to be talking about our long range vision when we are struggling to get to the next day healthy, happy and whole. But when I take time to reflect on the vision process we started what it did for us was to focus our future on God and God's will for our church and our own lives. We were looking forward to the future trusting in God with an anticipation of a bright future. That is exactly what is needed in this dark and unsure time of the COVID 19 pandemic. The visioning process helped us to connect and reconnect into the rock of Christ Jesus. We found ourselves on solid ground when the storm came.

The second important event that happened was choosing to focus on communicating with God during our time of Lent. We asked God to Open the Flood gates in our church and our lives through utilizing the five Breakthrough Prayer Practices presented in the book "Ultimate Reliance" by Sue Nilson Kibbey. We learned about:

- **1. Upsurge BTP** "Lead me to a rock that is higher than I." Psalm 61:2
- **2. Do Not Be Afraid BTP** "Be Not Afraid, for I am with you." Isaiah 41:10

- 3. Let There Be Light BTP "Let there be light." Genesis 1:3-4
- **4. Holy Surrender BTP** "Thy will be done." Matthew 6:10
- **5. Pick-axe BTP** "Keep asking, Keep seeking and Keep knocking." Matthew 7:7

Prayer is essential to the life of a maturing disciple. Prayer is how we communicate with God. We have a God who loves us to the uttermost and is madly in love with us. We live in a fallen disease filled world that God is redeeming one person at a time by inviting them to accept his Son Jesus as their Lord and Savior. When we accept Jesus into our lives the indwelling of the Holy Spirit connects us to God through Jesus. Our prayer life becomes the lifeblood for knowing God and being formed into the image of his Son. During this time of Sheltering in place, I am praying that you take your extra time and spent a good portion of it with God through utilizing these five Breakthrough Prayers. Through constant prayer, we are drilling our footings deep into the rock of our salvation found in our relationship with Jesus.

- 2. **Wednesday email blast:** I will be sending out an email blast each week with the latest information on the COVID 10 pandemic that affects the life of our church.
- 3. **ZOOM meetings:** To comply with the State and National mandates to shelter in place Pastor Heewon and I are urging our leadership chairs and G2 group members to download ZOOM go to meeting on your computers or cellphones (you don't have to have video, you can participate by audio only). To **download** and **Zoom** Application: Go to https://zoom.us/download and from the **Download** center, click on the **Download** button under "Zoom Client for Meetings". This application will automatically **download** when you start your first **Zoom** Meeting.

As I bring my letter to a close I want you to know that God will bring us through this dark and trying time. We have been fortunate in Dixon and Lee County so far with no confirmed cases of Coronavirus. Continue to pray, pray. Stay connected by using Facebook, email and our website. Don't forget to call someone and share time together. Call someone from our church and someone who isn't. Share the love of God! As someone posted on Facebook: The church is not a building and it is not empty. It is deployed!!!!

Practice #5 "Pickaxe" Keep Asking, Seeking, Knocking Matthew 7:7



If the Lord doesn't guard the city,


the guards are watching for nothing. (Psalm 127:1)


