GETTING TO KNOW YOU

- 1. In your memory of anger, what situation do you remember made you the most upset?
- 2. Have you ever given testimony or spoken up in another's defense? In the case, what was easy or hard for you to do?

GOING DEEPER/ Dixon First Reads Together

Amos: *Characteristics:* Whereas his contemporary, Hosea, focuses on the love of God and spiritual adultery, Amos focuses on the righteousness of God and social injustice. He often makes his points by use of a simple rhetorical question (e.g., 5:25). Amos speaks as a simple Judean farmer burdened for the materialistic nation of Israel. His prayer averts the total destruction of Israel (7:1-6), and yet his message was most unpopular. However, social acceptance didn't matter to one whose job was not on the line (7:12-15). In Amos, God roars like a lion (1:2) and brings hope only at the end (9:11-15). The book of Amos is constantly shadowed by clouds of judgment as the Lord reacts to the cruel social events in the land. Amos' message is an uncomfortable one in any age. Amos challenges us to examine ourselves and our society and to confront in justice wherever we find it.¹

Monday: Amos 4: Cows of Bashan

For Amos, the way we treat the needy is the area by which we are judged. To what extent do you think the Christian churches get involved in trying to alleviate poverty and oppression?

What would it mean for you to prepare to meet God? Would that instill in you fear or joy?

Tuesday: Amos 5: Justice Like a River

Recall a time you wanted, even prayed, for someone you loved to make a positive change in their life. What happened and how did you feel about it?

The Lord says, "Seek me and live" (v.4) What spiritual disciplines help you feel more alive in the Lord?
