15 Now all the tax collectors and sinners were coming near to listen to him. ² And the Pharisees and the scribes were grumbling and saying, "This fellow welcomes sinners and eats with them." ³So he told them this parable: ⁴ "Which one of you, having a hundred sheep and losing one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the one that is lost until he finds it? ⁵ And when he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders and rejoices. ⁶ And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and neighbors, saying to them, 'Rejoice with me, for I have found my lost sheep.' ⁷ Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who need no repentance. ⁸ "Or what woman having ten silver coins, if she loses one of them, does not light a lamp, sweep the house, and search carefully until she finds it? ⁹ And when she has found it, she calls together her friends and neighbors, saying, 'Rejoice with me, for I have found the coin that I had lost.' ¹⁰ Just so, I tell you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents."

Going Deeper – *Questions for deeper reflection* Read Luke 15:1-10

- To whom is this parable directed? How does that impact our understanding of this parable?
- Which group (outcast/lost or Pharisees/scribes) are the ones likely to feel like they are on the outside?
- While many are more familiar with the so-called parable of the prodigal son in the next part of the parable following Luke 15:1-10, Jesus tells all three stories as one parable (15:3). How do these first two stories set up the following parable?
- Who in our neighborhoods would likely point to themselves as outsiders? How do we continue to do the work of seeking and finding?
- Who, in our world, would consider themselves "lost"? How would this parable be received as good news?

Prayer - Lord, your mercies are new every morning, and all day long you work for redemption. Stir up in us the desire to be your disciples in all areas of our lives, that others would see in us your grace, mercy, and love. Amen.
