GOING DEEPER - Questions for deeper reflection

Reflecting on Pastor Tim's message is there anything that touched you that you wish to talk about?

Read Matthew 2:4-6

When he had called together all the people's chief priests and teachers of the law, he asked them where the Messiah was to be born. "In Bethlehem in Judea," they replied, "for this is what the prophet has written: "'But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for out of you will come a ruler who will shepherd my people Israel."

- 1. Have you ever had an experience where your life was impacted in a big way by something (or someone) small in the eyes of the world?
- 2. We all feel powerless at times. Have there been times you felt insignificant and unable to make change or progress in your life? How did God help you?
- 3 Think about the very simple way God entered the world in Christ. A young girl, a bewildered husband, shepherds, a manger, animals, a small town and dusty roads—all are an integral part of the story of Advent and Christmas. How did God use the small and insignificant to deliver his brightest message in the world, what does that tell you about what and who God wants to use now?

Closing Prayer: Father, it is amazing how often you choose the small and insignificant things and people in the world to actually change it. We are grateful that you know each of our names, our stories, and our hopes and dreams, and that you welcome us to partner with you in touching our communities and relationships with your love. Help us to become the Love of God to those we touch this week. In Jesus' name we come, Amen.
