
God of Love & Power,



Greetings in the name of our Risen Lord and Savior Jesus Christ:

We are moving along in this season of Lent - Journeying toward Easter 2024. Easter is the day we celebrate the culmination of God's redemptive plan. We are being asked to make space to surrender to our beloved Triune God and allow the Holy Spirit to lead us on a journey of making more room in our hearts, minds, and souls for a deeper relationship with God. Pastoral Perceptions



Greetings to my sisters and brothers in Christ of Dixon First UMC!

As many of you might know, I was recommended to become a provisional elder of Northern Illinois Conference on my third attempt at the commissioning interview on February 5th, this year. In other words, I am now at a crossing over point, going on toward the next step of my call to ordained ministry. Physically this is a crossing over from the membership of a local pastor to the membership of a provisional elder in our annual conference, but spiritually to a more demanding stage of sanctification, that is, to live more like Jesus, as a pastor seeking ordination.

What does this crossing over mean for me to follow the call to ordained ministry? This is a question that I have been asking myself through my spiritual journey in the ordination process. Many of you have also asked me about my path to follow the call to pastoral ministry.

Through the experience of receiving two rejections or “not yet” from previous commissioning interviews, God gave me answers to this question. First, God let me know something, through the entire experience of seeking ordination, that we are reminded of repetitively: it is God, not us, who has planned and prepared us to follow the call to be used as His hands and feet. What we can do is to say “Yes” to Jesus and cross over into a new experience or a new phase of life where we are invited to take up our own cross, even with the fear of the growing pains we may face in doing so.

Surely receiving “not yet” twice was disappointing and made me feel rejected by God at the very moment that I received the results. I doubted my call to ordained ministry. However, it didn’t take long to be reminded and reaffirmed in my call. I realized that God wanted me to be humbler and better equipped for the ministry to serve God and God’s people - with the same love and servanthip that Jesus modeled for us.

Second, God always reminds me of the amazing love and grace that I have experienced in the loving relationship with God and with my loving family in Christ, through the power of the Holy Spirit. This is the only source of power for me to move forward in a crossing over into a new phase of my call to ordained ministry - even with the anticipation of my own growing pains. With the experience of God’s love and grace through the people of God, we can all move on at any crossing over toward the next phase of our lives even with fear of growing pains.

When Jesus tells His disciples that He must suffer the trial and death that leads to the cross, the disciples cannot accept it. Nobody seems to understand Jesus’ messiahship of suffering and sacrificial death on the cross for our salvation from sin. But Jesus has shown us this messiahship through His life, His ministry, His suffering and death on the cross, and His resurrection. He calls us to follow Him as His disciples and witnesses of His love and grace on the path to the cross. As He says in Matthew 16:24, *“If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me.”*

We are on the path to the cross on our Lenten journey, following Jesus as his disciples and looking forward to meeting with the risen Jesus on the Easter morning. As Jesus calls us to take up the cross and follow him, we can expect to face a crossing over at the invitation to a sometimes demanding ministry as Jesus’ disciples. Many times, we hesitate with the excuse that we need to be more qualified or prepared for the call before we can say “yes” to Jesus.

But remember, it is not us but God who is the proactive protagonist of our lives, empowering us to follow Jesus as His disciples throughout our Lenten journey to the cross. We are always surrounded by God’s love and grace through Jesus Christ, in the power and guidance of the Holy Spirit, our loving relationship with God and our loving family in Christ. Amen.

Green Notes

Genesis 2:15 The Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and to keep it.

March has arrived and people are beginning to plan their gardens. A successful garden needs proper soil preparation. Clean up the garden area. Get rid of leaves and other debris that may have accumulated. Be sure to loosen the soil so water can reach the roots. The University of Illinois Extension can test your soil for acidity or alkalinity. They may recommend ways to improve your soil's nutritional value for maximum success.

After the soil is prepared, you can choose what to plant. If planting flowers, choose plants native to the area. They thrive better where they have naturally evolved and are familiar to local pollinators. Many of the caterpillars, birds, insects, and bees that pollinate plants are endangered. Without pollinators there wouldn't be many crops to harvest from farm fields or vegetable gardens. Avoid using chemicals to control weeds and pests. Protect flowering plants and pollinator nesting sites.

A recent article in the Dixon Telegraph spotlighted the pollinator-friendly yard of a local woman, Dayona Smith. Experts estimate the over 80% of plants are pollinated by birds and insects. It stands to reason that we should attract pollinators if we want successful gardens. By attracting butterflies and bees, much of your vegetable gardens will be of better quality, especially foods such as squash, cucumber, and pumpkins.

Dayona Smith recommends growing zinnias and cosmos in your flower garden. You can order free seeds by sending a self-addressed stamped envelope to Dayona Farm Foundation, P.O. Box 51, Van Orin, IL 61374. Seeds will be mailed during May and June. They also accept donations.

For other ideas on what, when, and where to plant, there are at least two master Gardeners affiliated with our church: Nancy Wadsworth and Tom Cartwright. Both are willing to help to help if asked. If they don't know the answer, they know who to ask.

The local Extension office can also be a resource. They are offering some local workshops that might be of interest. The workshops are free but registration at go.illinois.edu/FourSeasons is required.

Get ready to enjoy your garden, be it flowers or vegetables. Any excess produced can be donated to God's Garden Table. If you plant pollinator-friendly flowers, the Garden Table could be overflowing!


