Watching the Sunrise over the treetops brings an exhilarating feeling as I am reminded that Jesus Christ rose from the dead and is alive forevermore! He is RISEN!!!

I have heard it said that it is the Easter event that defines us as Christians. Actually, it is the culminating event that defines us as Christians. What defines us is Jesus Christ! Our goal is to maximize the gifts of our congregation to fulfill our Beyond the Horizon Vision. We constantly remind ourselves that God is in charge and leading us to God-preferred vision for our congregation.

# Pastoral Perceptions



Greetings in the name of our Risen Christ Jesus, Our Lord and Savior!

Spring has come already but with occasional chilly and snowy weather, it's telling us that winter is still around us, hesitating to leave. When we visit Walmart, we can see the potting soil and various kinds of plants and flower seed already for sale. As we look forward to the Easter week ahead, after our six weeks' Lenten journey, this mix of seasons makes us reflect on the path that Jesus took to the cross and died for our salvation from sin. He defeated the death and rose again to give us eternal life. In other words, Jesus was going through the winter of Lent to the cross and died for us on the cross. He brought us the life of spring through his resurrection by defeating the death of winter, giving us hope for eternal life .

For the last few months, we have lost five members of our beloved family in Christ. My heart was broken for the passing of all these people. They are all my beloved family members in Christ, with whom I have shared my life since starting my first pastoral ministry at Dixon First. I visited many in their homes, sharing our life stories with joys and concerns, and prayed for them to be surrounded by God's love and grace. For others, we worshipped together on Sundays and any other Christian holidays, met at other church events, shared our lives together by serving others in the church, and hugged each other with prayers for their good health and peace. Even though we did not spend a lot of time together, I felt so closely connected to them through the love of Jesus who has called me to serve God and neighbors.

So, just like the loss of others we've experienced the last few years, the loss of these five members of my family in Christ - one right after another within a few months, has made it hard for me to keep my focus on my ministry of the church. This continued experience of grieving has made me reflect on the grief of Jesus' disciples when they saw Jesus' death on the cross. They, too, must have felt devastated and frustrated because they did not seem to understand very well what Jesus told them about His death, His resurrection, His ascending to heaven, His constant presence with us through the Holy Spirit, and His coming back.

**14** "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Believe in God; believe also in me.<sup>2</sup> In my Father's house there are many dwelling places. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you?<sup>3</sup> And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, so that where I am, there you may be also. (John 14:1-3, NRSVUE)

When they witnessed the resurrection of Jesus on the first Easter, they understood and believed what Jesus said. They could follow Jesus, as Jesus said in Matthew 16:24, by denying themselves and taking up their cross through the power of the Holy Spirit.

Like Jesus' disciples, we can also feel devastated and frustrated in grief for the loss of our loved ones. We might feel that our broken hearts will continue grieving forever without our faith in the resurrection of Jesus. As we listen to what Jesus tells us in John 14 (above) and we trust in the promise of His resurrection, we are to feel peace and comfort even in the midst of the grief. We are surrounded by God's love and peace with hope for eternal life given to us through our faith in the resurrection of Jesus. May God's abundant blessings be with us throughout our Lenten journey and may we rejoice in meeting with our risen Christ on Easter morning! Happy Easter!!!

Now that April has arrived, we can expect April showers to bring May flowers. Have you ever considered collecting rain water to use on your garden or lawn? Rain water is free and saves on your water bill. You can buy commercially-made rain barrels at stores like Menard's. Some Extension offices have a few for sale. Most cost \$80-\$200 or more. If you are handy with tools, you can make your own rain barrel. There are directions available on the internet. The library may have information as well. Be sure to drain the barrel before freezing temperatures arrive.

There are several other ways to conserve eater. Here are a few:

- Turn off water during a task such as brushing your teeth or rinsing dishes for the dishwasher.
- use low-flow shower heads and faucet aerators.
- take a shower instead of a bath. Shower less often.
- wash dishes and laundry on full loads.
- -repair faucet, toilet and water heater leaks as soon as possible.

By conserving water, you are saving money and helping the environment. Let's do our part for our planet.
